Brett has starred on ABC TV's *Question Everything* and *Spicks & Specks*. He has regularly appeared on the *Melbourne Comedy Festival Gala* and was a scene stealer in the Jamie Doran thriller *The Tourist* on Stan. Brett's comedy special *Bogan Genius* was released in 2022 on Paramount + and his latest, *Go Hard or Go Home*, has been racking up the views on his YouTube channel.
